Shelters, Rehousing and Supportive housing programs for people experiencing homelessness, regardless of immigration/documentation status.

Rapid **rehousing** and **supporting housing programs application**. Eligibility is determined based on literal homelessness status and length of time homeless – with priorities for those experiencing chronic homelessness.

Adult Protective Services

Hotline and social case work team to receive and **investigate** reports of suspected **mistreatment and/or self-neglect of at-risk adults**, and **case planning** to stop risk for future mistreatment or self-neglect. Must be 18 years or older with cognitive or physical impairments that impact ability to manage safety and self-care.

Burial Assistance

General assistance services to provide **burial assistance** for individuals and families facing hardship in Denver. Applicants must be in Denver for at least 30 days and must be able to verify address with mail (paystub, bill, lease, etc).





Child Welfare

Casework, behavioral health treatment, protection and prevention, family reunification, case services, independent living, adoption recruitment and administration. This service is available for Denver children and families involved in welfare.

Emergency Housing Assistance

Financial assistance to pay for housing for Denver residents who had an unexpected expense and need help with rent or mortgage. This is available to those who have lived in Denver for at least 30-days.

GIVE Center

(720) 944-4483

The GIVE center provides **essential services** to Denver residents in need. Residents will complete an intake process that identifies the need of the person. Residents can only do the intake 1 per month but can have access to resources more often. **Resource include: hygiene supplies, reading glasses, clothing, bookbags and school supplies in the fall, etc.** and are collected during 3 donation drives during the year. The GIVE center is open 4 days a week on a walk-in basis. This is available for individuals who have been in Denver for at least 30 days.

RTD's LiVE program offers discounted fares in the RTD service areas.

Unaccompanied Refugee Minor (URM)

The Unaccompanied Refugee Minor (URM) program provides culturally and linguistically appropriate foster care and independent living placements for refugee-eligible unaccompanied minors in the United States. The goals of the URM program are first to reunify program youth with family or kin and second to provide programming that facilitates social, cultural and economic integration. Office of Refugee Resettlement determines eligibility for the program.





Emergency Medical Services (800) 221-3943

EMS only covers family planning and emergency services medical care. This coverage lasts 12 months. After the 12 moths, you will need to reapply for coverage. *Information you provide on your application is confidential and cannot be shared with U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services. Colorado law protects your personal information when applying for or enrolling in most public benefits. Your information may only be shared with some federal agencies if there is an audit from the Center for Medicare and Medicaid Services and the Office of the Inspector General. If shared, the information does not impact your immigration status and can't be used in a public charge decision.

Issues all business/professional licenses for the City and County of Denver. Determines the qualifications of applicants. Conducts background checks. Determines which licenses should be issued. Collects fees. Grants, renews, and denies applications. An example of a license offered is a Peddlers license (see below).

Peddlers License

A peddler is someone who goes from place to place selling small items. This is person who sells non-perishable food items to the public from a non-fixed location but does not work out of food truck or food cart. To apply for this license, the applicant needs a government issued identification and must be at least 18 years of age. Foreign issued identification is also accepted.

Wellness Winnie is Denver's mobile unit offering support, assistance, and resources to those in need. Wellness Winnie has a scheduled travel route through Denver that provides **behavioral health** and support. A Spanish-language interpreter is available upon request at the site, or by calling or texting (720) 908-5401.



HIV Resource and Services

Denver HIV Resources offers access to services such as **health care**, **case management**, **support groups**, **financial assistance**, **food support**, and more. They also provide guidance and technical assistance to HIV care and service providers.

Health care law says that everyone is required to have **health insurance**. No one can be refused health insurance by a company because of a pre-existing condition.

Office of Financial Empowerment and Protection

Provides citywide consumer financial protection for individuals, families, and small businesses that include wage theft, unfair lending and housing practices, elder financial abuse, notario fraud, and financial navigation.

Wage Theft

Wage theft occurs when employers do not pay workers according to the law. Examples of wage theft include not paying owed wages, paying less than minimum wage, not paying workers overtime, not allowing workers to take meal and rest breaks, requiring off the clock work, or taking workers' tips.

Unfair Lending & Housing Practices

Housing discrimination is illegal in nearly all housing, including private housing, public housing, and housing that receives federal funding. Our housing support includes Evictions, Foreclosures, Landlord disputes, and legal support.

Elder Financial Abuse

Elder Financial abuse is a common tactic used by abusers to gain power and control in a relationship. The forms of financial abuse may be subtle or overt but in in general, include tactics to conceal information, limit the victim's access to assets, or reduce accessibility to the family finances.

Notario Fraud

Individuals who represent themselves as qualified to offer legal advice or services concerning immigration or other matters of law, who have no such qualification, routinely victimize members of immigration communities.

Financial Navigation

Financial navigation that includes Eviction assistance, Foreclosure assistance, Housing and rental assistance, Legal services, Mediation services, And other supportive services (Food, Rent, Jobs, Child Care etc.)

The kind of services provided at each school is determined by the number of English language learners at the school.

As a part of the ELA, there are 2 newcomer centers, located at Merrill Middle School and South High School, that provide instruction for limited English proficient middle school and high school students who are new to Denver Public Schools and have had limited or interrupted education. They offer intensive instruction in reading, writing, and understanding English for one or two semesters to prepare students for participation in an ESL or a transitional native language instruction model. Initial screening occurs in the home school, and those deemed appropriate are referred to the Newcomer Center for further evaluation.

Interpretation and translation services are provided in Arabic, Spanish, and Vietnamese.
